### Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Council

#### held on Wednesday 11th May 2022

1.Mr Rob Goodliffe welcomed all present; apologies for absence were received from Cllr J Toye (NNDC).

<u>2.Appointment of Chairman</u>; following a proposal from WG, seconded by JH, Mr R Goodliffe was reelected as Chairman, nemcon; he signed his Declaration of Acceptance of Appointment.

2.1Appointment of vice-Chairman; AW proposed Mr G Cox as vice-Chairman and this was agreed. Under member responsibilities WG agreed to continue with SNAP, the SAM2 sign and the defibrillator as well as liaising with the MUGA group; Village Hall – liaison would continue as required; JH would continue to check the play area. PC governance – RG.

### 4. <u>Finance</u>

4.1 The Council adopted the Accounts for 2021-2022, proposer GC, all in favour. The accounts and Cashbook were signed by the Chairman and Clerk.

6.2 Other planning matters – enquiries would be made with the District Councillor re the dog exercising area by the village hall; also the current position re the Alby Horseshoes PH.

7. To consider one <u>co-option</u> to fill the vacancy on the Council – the Council had received an application from Mr S Seagrove and he was proposed for co-option by DW, all agreed. Mr Seagrove signed his Declaration of Acceptance and joined the Council.

8. <u>Play Area</u> – safety report – JH would resume weekly checks

- remaining refurbishment - benches, lottery signs, a picnic bench outside and possible sign refurbishment were next priorities; also the tower fixing screws and the gate needed to be monitored.

9.1 Members' Reports –

WG advised that the MUGA group would issue a lighting completion press release

AW advised the Jubilee events were in preparation and that St Mary's was starting an organ restoration fund appeal. He suggested that the responsibility for hedge maintenance around the playing field should be clarified.

DW advised that he was in touch with the Norfolk Ponds Project to establish if the pond on The Street would qualify for their works.
